EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Licensed Practical Nurses have a wide range of professional opportunities such as working in physician offices, clinics, hospitals, home health, hospice and long term care facilities.

JOB OUTLOOK

According to the United States Department of Labor Outlook Handbook, the need for licensed practical nurses is projected to increase by 16% during the time frame of 2014-2024. This growth is much faster than average in comparison with other occupations.

PROGRAM TRAINING INCLUDES

Multiple nursing courses cover basic nursing skills, fundamentals of nursing, medical surgical nursing, maternity nursing, and pediatric nursing. Other corresponding courses include math for nurses, pharmacology, anatomy and physiology, nutrition, growth and development and professional issues.

Students who successfully complete the program will be able to take the NCLEX-PN licensure examination to become licensed as a practical nurse (LPN).

LPN TO RN TRANSITION

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Registered Nurses have a wide range of professional opportunities available in all areas of healthcare. Registered Nursing roles range from bedside nursing care to supervisory and leadership roles in the healthcare system. Graduates of the program will be ready for entry-level employment in hospitals, long-term care facilities, post-acute skilled nursing facilities, home health care agencies, hospice, urgent care clinics, and physician offices.

JOB OUTLOOK

According to the United States Department of Labor Occupation Outlook Handbook, the need for registered nurses is projected to increase by 12% during the timeframe of 2018 through 2028. This growth is much faster than average in comparison with other occupations. The reason for the increase in demand is related to several factors. The chief reason is the shift in demographics related to the aging population. Seventy million baby boomers will reach the over 65-age group by 2030. Persons over the age of 65 account for 34 percent of surgical procedures, 26 percent of all doctor's visits, and 90 percent of all long-term care residents.

PROGRAM TRAINING INCLUDES

The program will include classroom, laboratory, and clinical instruction. Courses are Health Concepts I, Health Concepts II, Health Concepts III, Pediatric Nursing Concepts, Maternity Nursing Concepts, Psychiatric Nursing Concepts, and Professional Nursing Concepts. The conceptual framework incorporates both the NCSBN Clinical Judgment Measurement Model and Kristen Swanson's Theory of Caring within the Quality and Safety Education for Nurses (QSEN) competencies. Together these concepts will guide the faculty and students in reaching the program outcomes. Nursing is an art and a science and applying clinical judgment with caring is a major component of safe, competent, patient-centered nursing care.

POLICE ACADEMY

Police Academy provides students with training required by the Ohio Peace Officers Training Commission (OPOTC) to pursue a career in law enforcement. Police Academy has been serving Van Wert and surrounding communities since 1994.

Program consists of training in these areas: Firearms, Patrol, Investigation, Administration, Human Relations, Prisoner Booking & Handling, Traffic Enforcement, Legal, Civil Disorders, First Aid, Driving, Unarmed Self-Defense, O.C Pepper Spray, ASP Baton, Resume Writing, Homeland Security, & Physical Conditioning.

BASIC QUALIFICATIONS

Must be 18 years of age and have a valid driver's license and possess a high school diploma or its equivalent. Applicants will be required to submit and pass a drug screen and a physical conditioning pre-test. Class size is limited.

Training is under the direction of a State of Ohio approved Academy Commander. Successful candidates will receive a certificate of completion and take the State of Ohio Exam. Passing the state exam entitles graduates to be certified by the State of Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC).

The pre-hospital career path of an Emergency Medical Technician is an ever changing and growing one in today's Emergency Medical Services environment. Whether you choose to serve your community in a volunteer capacity, or choose this path as a profession, the opportunities are many. The Basic EMT program, is the first step, on this pathway. The Emergency Medical Technician course is a 150-hour long program that will provide you with the necessary knowledge and skill set to function on an ambulance in the capacity of a Basic EMT, or in any other facility that employs the skills of Basic EMT personnel.

FIREFIGHTER I



KEY INFORMATION

Duration: Minimum 160 Clock Hours plus 16 hours for EVOC and 8 hours for basic first-aid/CPR if necessary

Class Schedule: Classes will meet Tue. & Thur. each week from 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm and most Saturdays Firefighters continue to be in high demand, especially in rural/volunteer areas. Seventy percent of firefighters in the United States are Volunteers. These training courses will prepare individuals to serve their local communities, as well as provide a solid foundation to further their training as career/paid firefighters. Firefighter Program currently offers Firefighter I. The Firefighter I class is a minimum of 160 hours. The Firefighter I classes require that students complete an Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC) of 16 hours and a basic first-aid/CPR class of 8 hours to obtain their final certification. Contact us if interested. Students who have completed an EVOC course within one year of the start date of the Firefighter class and have a certificate will be excused during that portion. Students who possess a current Emergency Medical Technician certification will be excused from the basic first-aid/CPR portion. Students who complete these classes will receive a certificate and are eligible to take the Ohio Department of Public Safety Division of Emergency Medical Services certification exam for the appropriate level of Firefighter.

BASIC QUALIFICATIONS

Must be 18 years of age, except that a chartered fire training program may admit a student who is 17 years old provided that the student has graduated or is enrolled in the twelfth (12th) or final grade in a secondary school program. Applicants shall have not been convicted of any of the following: (1) any felony; (2) a misdemeanor committed in the course of practice; (3) a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude. Applicants shall have not committed fraud, misrepresentation, or material deception in applying for or obtaining a certificate issued under section 4765.55 of the Ohio Revised Code and Chapter 4765-20 of the Ohio Administrative Code. Will need to complete a background check. Firefighter I applicants must obtain an NFPA 1582 compliant physical. All applicants must complete the ICS 100 and National Incident Management (NIMS) 700 course prior to start of class.

BASIC QUALIFICATIONS FOR EMT

ORC 4765-7 (20) Shall allow a student who is at least 17 years old, who is enrolled in the twelfth or final grade in a secondary school program and who otherwise meets the requirements for admission into the EMS training program to be admitted and to complete the emergency medical training program. Upon successful completion of the EMS training program, and after having successfully passed and received certification from The National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians, students can then apply for a certificate to practice in the State of Ohio. EMS certifications are issued by the State Board of Emergency Medical, Fire, and Transportation Services through the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Division of Emergency Medical Services. In accordance with section 4765.55 of the Ohio Revised Code.

STNA & CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS

STATE TESTED NURSING ASSISTANT (STNA)

This course offers 80 hours of training including 16 hours of clinical experience in a long-term care facility. Students completing the program are eligible to take the state test for long-term care nursing assistants. Students will need the following before clinicals: a two-step Mantoux test from the Health Department or your doctor's office (prior test must have been given within the last 6 months), comfortable black shoes (cannot be open-toed or open heeled), and t-shirt (included in tuition). Students need a valid picture ID plus their SS card (not just the number) to be presented at first day of class and at testing.

Clinical hours held on Fridays. Mantoux tests take two weeks, please start before classes begin.

BASIC LIFE SUPPORT HEALTHCARE WORKERS (6 HRS)

This course is designed for healthcare professionals and other personnel who need to know how to perform CPR and other basic cardiovascular life support skills in a wide variety of in-facility and prehospital settings. The CPR course teaches American Heart Association Basic Life Support for healthcare providers, which is ideal for professions such as LPNs, professional rescuers and lifeguards. This course includes one-man CPR, two-man CPR, infant and child CPR, bag mask breathing and AED training.

PHLEBOTOMY

This certificate program provides students with 100 total hours of training held in both the classroom at Vantage Career Center and in local healthcare facilities. During this career training program, students will be given the opportunity to learn how to draw blood from individuals. The student will also learn the processing and distribution of the laboratory specimens. Also, during the program, you will learn safety standouts, quality control procedures along with ethical, legal and regulatory matters.

Successful graduates are those who have completed 100 total hours of training including 100 successful venipunctures. Vantage Career Center will issue a certificate of completion. Students will then be eligible to sit for the National Healthcare association (NHA) Certification Exam.

CPR ADULT, INFANT AND CHILD, AED & FIRST AID (8 HOURS WITH 30 MINUTE LUNCH)

This is a combined course with First Aid in the morning and CPR in the afternoon. Both the CPR & First Aid course meets state requirements for childcare workers and providers. The required form for participant's records will be provided.

CHILD ABUSE SEMINAR (6 HRS)

This seminar will cover the definitions of child abuse, deal with the emotional aspects of child abuse, physical and behavioral indicators of child abuse and neglect victims, how to report abuse/neglect, and penalty for failing to report. This seminar meets all requirements needed for certifications by the Department of Ohio Education and Department of Human Services for childcare workers and providers.

CHILD ABUSE REFRESHER (3 HRS)

If the six-hour seminar has been taken within the last three years, only the refresher course is needed to renew certification.

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE SEMINAR (6 HRS)

This seminar meets all requirements for certification by the Department of Job and Family Services for childcare workers and providers.

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE REFRESHER (3 HRS)

If the six-hour seminar has been taken in the last three years, only the refresher course is needed to renew certification.

WELDING

This class will expose learners to shop safety, common welding and cutting processes, blueprint reading, welding symbols, and thermal cutting practices. Students with welding experience will be able to select a welding process for hands-on practice to prepare for an AWS Welding Certification test.

WELDING CERTIFICATIONS

Vantage Career Center is an Accredited Test Facility for the American Welding Society. With this accreditation we can test, and upon satisfactory completion, grant American Welding Society (AWS) certifications. These certifications are nationally recognized by employers and prove the individual possesses fundamental welding skills and knowledge. AWS tests must be scheduled in advance. Tests and pricing information is listed below.



BEGINNING WELDING

An introduction to welding using both oxyacetylene flame and electric arc. Course includes shop safety, fusion of metals, identification of electrodes and equipment set up. Practice in running beads on flat, horizontal surfaces and joints included.

INTERMEDIATE WELDING

Develop skills with further training and practice with gas and arc on vertical and overhead welding. Increase skills with brazing and cutting. TIG and MIG may be included along with Heli arc welding in all positions.

ADVANCED WELDING

Participants will identify and concentrate on particular welding skills, identifying certifications they wish to achieve and directing efforts and practice towards enhancing and perfecting these skills in a safety -focused, instructor led lab.

FORKLIFT SAFETY

This course covers training, testing, and driving of the forklift truck. Operator license will be issued upon satisfactory completion. Meets OSHA requirements.

CDL PROGRAM

Truck Drivers are in high demand. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of truck drivers is projected to grow 5% from 2019-2029. Faster than the average for all occupations.

This 200 hour program will give students the knowledge and skills necessary to take the licensing exam for a class "A" Commercial Driver's License (CDL). Students will receive 50 hours of theoretical training and 150 hours of hands on training.



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum age of 18
- > Hold a valid driver's license
- Pass a Department of Transportation physical
- Pass a Drug Screen
- No more than 6 points on current driver's license
- No DUI/DWI or Reckless Operation citation within the last 3 years
- No drug-related felonies

NOTE: Those under the age of 21 may obtain an intrastate CDL only.

COMPUTERIZED ACCOUNTING FOR FARMERS

Financial records are very important for farmers. Not only are they necessary for the IRS, but for farmers to make decisions on what enterprises are the most profitable. Vantage Career Center offers a computer program (The Agricultural Business System TABS) that can perform these functions accurately. TABS will be loaded on your computer so that you have accurate records at your fingertips. You do not need to know accounting to use it. You have unlimited instruction at your farm office the first year. After that, phone assistance is free and farm office visits are available. TABS provides 1040F tax reports, balance sheets for lenders, bank reconciliation, depreciation, and payroll with all payroll reports including W-2s. TABS is being used by nearly 100 farmers in the area.

COST: \$350 for installation and first year support. Yearly support varies as to farm office location and services desired. Similar programs cost \$1,000 to \$2,000.

CAREER ASSESSMENT SERVICES & CLASSES

The Assessment Center at Vantage Career Center is an authorized test administration facility for a number of career-related certificates and credentials. Our assessment services provide potential students and other test candidates the opportunity to complete a variety of exams through vendors such as Pearson VUETM, Certiport, Castle/Scantron, and others, in a comfortable, local environment.

WorkKeys® assessment results can assist students, educators and industries by identifying skills needed for success in adult career-technical training or workplace settings. Performance on the WorkKeys® may also qualify the individual for the National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC), an industry-recognized credential based on documented benchmarks and skills.

TYPES OF AID AVAILABLE FOR THOSE WHO QUALIFY

FEDERAL GRANTS: PELL & FEDERAL SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANT

The federal government provides grants for students attending college or career school. Most types of grants, unlike loans, are sources of free money that generally do not have to be repaid. Pell and FSEOG grants are awarded to students based on financial need and who have not earned a bachelor's, graduate, or professional degree. The amount you get will depend on your expected family contribution (EFC) determined from the FAFSA, your cost of attendance, and the number of clock hours in your specific program. To apply, complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®). Vantage Career Center's Federal School Code is 030956.

FEDERAL STUDENT LOANS: DIRECT SUBSIDIZED & UNSUBSIDIZED LOANS

<u>Direct Subsidized Loans</u> are loans made to eligible students who demonstrate financial need. The government usually pays your interest while you are enrolled at least half-time in school plus the six month grace period or deferment periods.

<u>Direct Unsubsidized Loans</u> are not based on financial need. Interest begins accruing on this type of loan immediately when disbursed by the school.

The financial aid office will determine loan amounts based on dependency status, program length and cost of attendance for your specific program.
