The awards ceremony is truly the proper send-off for a group of students who will have earned their status as Vantage Career Center alumni.

Advisory Board meetings are wrapping up for the school year as well as Webxam and ASE testing.

The Carpentry House Project is nearing completion and getting ready to be auctioned off this summer. The students are doing a great job on it along with their instructor, Mr. Robinson.

The CDL program finished the first group of students with all seven of the students passing their tests. The final four students for the year are close to finishing their driving hours and will be testing shortly. The total number of high school students obtaining their CDL is now at 105.

Mr. Edwards and the entire Auto Collision program students are inviting their parents and guests into Vantage on May 9th in order to see all the projects that the students have completed this school year.

Special thanks to the Welding program and Mr. Cearns for completing a big project (foldable brackets) for the Parkway Athletic Building. The Construction Equipment Technology program, the Electricity program, as well as the Industrial Mechanics program have also been doing numerous projects for various community organizations and receiving great publicity for Vantage Career Center.

Criminal Justice students are busy finalizing their certifications. Seniors received their APCO training and are working toward becoming Dispatch certified. The juniors are finishing their CPR, First Aid, and Stop the Bleed certifications. Mr. Miller is collaborating with local law enforcement agencies to secure more field placement opportunities for his students during the 2025-2026 school year.

Mrs. Markward has completed her BGSU coursework and is now eligible to apply for an Advanced Career Tech Workforce Development License! All juniors have successfully received their CNA (formerly STNA) certification. Fifteen seniors have completed 30 venipunctures, which is a requirement to sit for their Phlebotomy certification. Phlebotomy certification testing will take place on May 7th.

Junior Cosmetology students, along with Mrs. Grothouse, will be spending these last few weeks on hair perming and chemical relaxers. Juniors will get to put their skills to the test with their first clients during our summer bootcamp. Mrs. Grothouse and Mrs. Smith incorporated eyelash lift and tint into the curriculum this year. The Avantage Salon closed on April 30th. We're excited to announce that we have six cosmetology students who are on early work placement in our local communities! Ohio Cosmetology State Board results are expected in the near future.

Great work to the junior students in Early Childhood Education who are gaining practical experience for their CDA credentialing through lab hours and volunteer opportunities. Seniors are nearing completion of their CDA testing, and we currently have a 100% passage rate for those who have tested. The countdown to summer is on for the preschool students; their last day of school and end-of-year program will be held on May 8th. Thank you to Mrs. Moreno for all of her hard work during her first year as our Preschool Head Teacher. Congratulations to Mrs. Baker as she has also completed her BGSU coursework and will be eligible for an Advanced Career Tech Workforce Development License!

Mrs. DeWert and the Interactive Media students have been hard at work creating door number stickers and installing them around the school. This is an initiative that came out of the Safety Committee. Students recently completed their Adobe Certification testing; the juniors took the

Photoshop test, and the seniors took the Animate test. In order to keep up with local job market demands, Mrs. DeWert plans to change her senior first-semester course from Web Design to Video and Sound; she has been working to develop a new curriculum for this change.

Mr. Shardelow, Ms. Hannekratt, and the Culinary Arts students have been very busy. They have been hard at work on a variety of certifications such as OSHA 10, ServSafe Handler, and ServSafe Manager. On Thursday, April 17th, Senior Culinary Arts students displayed their cake projects in the Commons for students and staff to vote on their favorites and bid to take one home via a silent auction. The Cup & Saucer closed for the school year on April 25th.

Health Information Management Senior, Melania Kroeger (St. John's), took 6th place at the HOSA State Competition in Medical Spelling. Congratulations, Melania and Mrs. Laing. Medical Assisting Juniors are currently participating in a 30-hour shadowing rotation at Van Wert Ohio Health. Thank you to Mrs. Laing and Emily Lichtenberger of Ohio Health for all their hard work and collaboration to make this opportunity a reality for our students.

Transition to Work students, along with Mrs. Webster's Success class, will be planting the school garden. Students are hard at work, under the guidance of Mrs. Farr and Mrs. Allen, creating freshies, decor, and soaps to stock up our local vendors before summer break.

Network Systems Junior, Owen Stetler (Parkway), qualified for nationals in the BPA Server Administration using Microsoft competition. Congratulations to Owen and Mr. Regedanz on this great achievement. Our IT Help Desk through Network Systems closed down shop on April 28th. Thank you again to staff and students for allowing students to work on technology pieces throughout the year.

Mrs. Baulme took her Sports Exercise Therapy students to Parkview Field, home of the Tincaps, last month. Their trainers do an excellent job sharing their educational pathway, job requirements, and future professional goals. Seniors are also gearing up for their Physical Therapy Aide and Personal Trainer certifications. This year, the Vantage Bloodmobile collected a record number of units of blood; for these efforts, the American Red Cross will provide \$5,000 to be awarded to Vantage seniors in the form of scholarships.


Currently working with juniors on who is interested in employment opportunities - will share this information with our county economic developments.


Currently, 49 students are engaged in the Work-Based Learning/Early Work Release program. We have established work-based learning agreements with 40 different businesses, representing multiple labs at Vantage.

PBIS- (Positive Behavioral Intervention Support) - Currently, 52 students (83.70%) of our students have been recognized for their Positive Behaviors.
