Meet with the Enrollment Coordinator

(Required of all applicants) Program requirements will be discussed, along with costs and pre-requisites.

Submit Program Application

A \$30 non-refundable application fee is required.

Schedule Pre-admission Exams

(Required of all applicants) WorkKeys must be completed. The Assessment Coordinator will notify students of their test scores and eligibility.

Physical Examination Form

Must be completed by a physician (Chiropractors are not acceptable). Your health insurance may cover the cost, or can be done at a walk-in clinic for \$67.

Drug Screening

Background Check (BCI/FBI)

You can complete it at the Vantage Career Center. The office is open Monday – Thursday 8:30a - 6p Friday 8:30a - 3p.

Health Requirements

Exact costs will vary depending on the student's insurance and previous immunization history. Often, healthcare employers will provide Mantoux, influenza, and hepatitis B vaccinations free of charge for their employees.

Students who can provide documentation of being previously vaccinated or an acceptable titer level demonstrating immunization do not need to repeat the vaccine.
