This meeting is a meeting of the Board of Education in public for the purpose of conducting the School District's business and is not to be considered a public community meeting. There is time for public participation during the meeting as indicated on this agenda.

#### **Vantage Board of Education Policy**

0169.1 Public Participation at Board Meetings

The Board of Education recognizes the value to school governance of public comment on educational issues and the importance of allowing members of the public to express themselves on school matters of community interest.

The Board is also committed to conducting its meetings in a productive and efficient manner that assures that the regular agenda of the Board is completed in a reasonable period of time, honors the voluntary nature of the Board's time and using that time efficiently, and allows for a fair and adequate opportunity for input to be considered. Consequently, public participation at Board meetings will be governed by the following principles:

A. Any person or group wishing to place an item on the agenda shall register their intent with the Superintendent no later than eight (8) days prior to the meeting and include:

- 1. name and address of the participant;
- 2. group affiliation, if and when appropriate;
- 3. topic to be addressed.

Such requests shall be subject to the approval of the Superintendent and the Board President.

- B. In order to permit the fair and orderly expression of such comment, the Board shall provide a period for public participation at every regular meeting of the Board and publish rules to govern such participation in Board meetings. The presiding officer of each Board meeting at which public participation is permitted shall administer the rules of the Board for its conduct. Where his/her ruling is disputed, it may be overruled by a majority of those Board members present and voting. The presiding officer shall be guided by the following rules:
- C. Public participation shall be permitted as indicated on the order of business.
- D. Anyone having a legitimate interest in the actions of the Board may participate during the public portion of a meeting.
- E. Participants must be recognized by the presiding officer and must preface their comments by an announcement of their name, address, and group affiliation, if and when appropriate.
- F. Each statement made by a participant shall be limited to three (3) minutes duration.
- G. No participant may speak more than once on the same topic unless all others who wish to speak on that topic have been heard.
- H. All statements shall be directed to the presiding officer; no person may address or question Board members individually.
- I. Tape or video recordings are permitted. The person operating the recorder should contact the Superintendent prior to the Board meeting to review possible placement of the equipment, and must agree to abide by the following conditions:

- 1. No obstructions are created between the Board and the audience.
- 2. No interviews are conducted in the meeting room while the Board is in session.
- 3. No commentary, adjustment of equipment, or positioning of operators is made that would distract either the Board or members of the audience while the Board is in session and not disrupt the meeting.
- J. The presiding officer may:
  - 1. Prohibit public comments that are frivolous, repetitive, and/or harassing;
- 2. Interrupt, warn, or terminate a participant's statement when the statement is too lengthy, personally directed, abusive, off-topic, antagonistic, obscene, or irrelevant;
- K. The portion of the meeting during which the participation of the public is invited shall be limited to thirty (30), unless extended by a vote of the Board.

#### Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Rick Turner thanked each Board of Education member for their time and dedication to Vantage, as well as associate school. It takes a real commitment to serve on a school Board, and each member serves on two Boards of Education, and we thank them for their service. Superintendent Turner updated the Board of the preparations to meet with the legislators in Columbus next week, one the major issues we will discuss are the options for obtaining a high school diploma for the classes beyond 2018. They created two additional options for the class of 2018, one of which specifically targeted career technical students. We will ask them to keep these two additional options. The feedback we are getting is that this is likely to happen, but we will see what their responses are next week. Additionally, Superintendent Turner will talk with the legislators about the continuing to work with ODE to create a viable teacher education program for Career Technical Instructors, given that SB3 removed the RESA requirement for them. We will also encourage our legislators to support language that recognizes OTC's as Institutions of Higher Learning.

High School Director Tony Unverferth reported the Ottoville VFW was presented with a check for \$185.00 at their December meeting from the Vantage Student Ambassadors flag field effort (in honor of Veteran's Day). Members of the organization expressed a great deal of gratitude, and even gave us a "gift" to share with all those involved. Director Unverferth also reported that the Construction Equipment Technologies program has been shadowing Weigand Construction at the new Van Wert County Hospital Outpatient and Ambulatory Care Center. The students are able to see first-hand how beams are set, concrete is formed and poured, and how the site work is performed. Electricity and Industrial Mechanics Instructors recently attended a three day seminar on Programmable Logic Controls (PLC's), held at Tri-Rivers Career Center and part of the RAMTEC initiative. Both instructors are now certified to teach the PLC curriculum in their programs. Lastly, Sophomore Visit Day is on February 2. Close to 800 sophomores from our 13 associate schools will be coming to visit Vantage Career Center. This gives them the opportunity to shadow and receive hands on training in two programs, one hour each, to

determine if they would like to pursue these labs for their junior and senior year.

The Putnam County Community Improvement Corporation (CIC), on behalf of Jackson Township, met with and received a "Proposed TIF Agreement Application" from Grote Farms on November 20, 2017 requesting forgiveness of taxes on real property improvements to be made at their site located at 21630 US 224, Ft. Jennings, OH 45844. At the meeting Mr. Tony Grote of Grote Farms, explained the proposed Agreement Application concerning the investment levels in real and personal property, the new job commitment numbers and the timeframe for construction and then agreed, if the forgiveness of taxes were to be approved by the Vantage Career Center and granted by Jackson Township, to abide by the terms and conditions of the TIF documents (the TIF Agreement and the Service Payment Agreement).

To address the maintenance costs of Road 22-K widening and overlay (US 224 north approximately 775 feet)., Jackson Township is proposing a 100% Tax Increment Financing (TIF) package for 15 years whereby Jackson Township would redirect a portion of the taxes generated by the facility for necessary yearly maintenance costs on Road 22-K widening and overlay (US 224 north approximately 775 feet).

Per Ohio Revised Code Section 5709.73, the Vantage Career Center must be notified in writing as to Grote Farms tax abatement request and because the tax abatement request exceeds 75% on real property improvements and a term of more than 10 years, the Vantage Career Center has a minimum of forty five (45) days to respond by Resolution to the Jackson Township of the School District's approval or disapproval of the abatement request. The Vantage Career Center has the authority to waive all or part of the 45 day notice requirement and respond to the tax abatement request at an earlier date. However, if the Board of Education waives their 45 day notice requirement, the Board shall then certify this waiver within their Resolution and respond to the Township as the Boards approval or disapproval of the tax abatement request. Upon receiving a Resolution or written notification from the Board of Education outlining their decision, Jackson Township by Resolution may approve and agree with the terms and conditions of the tax abatement requests. Jackson Township shall not pass a Resolution approving or agreeing to the tax abatement requests until receiving notification or a Resolution from Vantage Career Center.

Included with the TIF Agreement Application is a spread sheet, Exhibit "A" which shows two options "A" & "B". Option "A" explains the division of the revenue generated by the 25% payback involving the project with Vantage Career Center sharing the 25% payback with Jackson Township for 15 years. Exhibit "B" explains the incentive term of 15 years at 100% abatement with a 25% payback by Grote Farms, to the involved entities with Jackson Township's portion being shared equally between the Vantage Career Center & Ft. Jennings LSD.

The CIC shall prepare for Jackson Township all documents pertaining to the TIF Agreement and the Service Payment Agreement as per the request of Grote Farms

This letter from Jackson Township shall serve as official notification to the Vantage Career Center of the tax abatement request from Grote Farms. Because of construction time constraints and the time frame for the preparation of the TIF Agreement and the Service Payment Agreement, we request the Vantage Career Center respond to this notification and request from Grote Farms as soon as your schedule allows.
